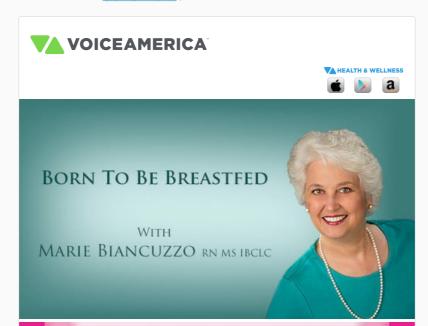
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December 11th 2017: Lactating After Loss: Companioning Bereaved Mothers and Families
