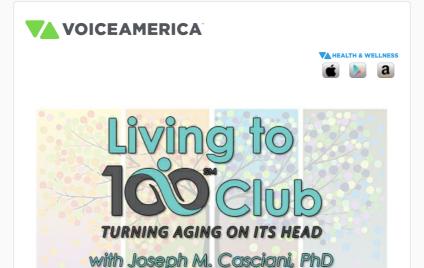
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November 8th 2019: Decision-Making Capacity in Older Adults
